## THE ROLE OF PARKS IN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

The Bahrain Garden Club continues to be under royal patronage, that of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, the current Honorary President. His Majesty King Hamad has always been keen to emphasize the importance of preserving the environment, which can be seen by the attention that the government, represented by His Royal Highness Sheikh Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister, pays to afforestation and to the commitment of the Kingdom of Bahrain to double the number of trees by the year 2035 aiming to reach zero neutrality by the year 2060.

The presence of public parks within a country is an indication of the country's interest in its citizens, and the extent of its care for the aesthetic image of the country and its tourist façade. It is evidence of a country's interest in preserving the environment. The Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, being the government entity in charge of parks in the Kingdom, pays great attention to the establishment of new parks and to the afforestation of roads, parks and intersections. The Bahrain Garden Club also plays a key role in raising awareness with regards to the importance of afforestation, creating green spaces and encouraging citizens and residents to establish and care for parks as well.

Through its partnerships with civil organizations and private institutions, the Ministry aims to enrich



its operations with the research and experience offered by organizations in the fields of agriculture, horticulture, greening and beautification projects. The ministry seeks to promote the culture of agriculture and raise awareness of its environmental and nutritional importance. We commend here the role of the Bahrain Garden Club and its Board of Directors in bridging this culture and developing public awareness in the field of public parks and home gardens preservation.



The Ministry's approach towards implementing agricultural beautification projects and afforestation is strategic in nature, in which various parties in the Kingdom, including government and private institutions, contribute to the implementation of the related efforts. Implementation of the National Afforestation Plan is underway, it aims to double the number of trees by the year 2035 from 1.8 million to approximately 3.6 million trees with the target of planting 140,000 tree per year has been exceeded in both the years 2022 and 2023.

Efforts to reduce carbon emissions by 50% by the year 2035 and reach zero neutrality by the year 2060 are continuous, these targets are in line with and in support of international initiatives designed to address climate challenges. The Kingdom of Bahrain is fully aware of the impact and effects of climate change and the need to coordinate efforts to address climate change challenges head on.

Park in the Capital Governorate, which was opened in 2023 and now serves the governorate with an area of 6 hectares and contains walkways for visitors, resting sites, children's games, and 300 parking spaces along with a number of other facilities. Al Kubra Garden is also another project executed by the Ministry. The park is located in the Muharraq Governorate and was inaugurated in the year 2021. It has an area of about 9 hectares, surrounded by a 1 km walkway, and includes children play areas, shaded family areas and 493 parking spaces. The development of Ain Al-Haniniya park in the Southern Governorate was completed last year with an area of more than 7,000 square meters, and included the revival of the historical Ain Al-Haniniya. Amongst other strategic projects as well is Barbar Park, opened in the Northern Governorate last year with an area of 8,484.5 square meters. All projects were designed with green spaces and targeted increased afforestation.



The Ministry, as part of its implementation of the afforestation plan, has made sure to select large evergreen trees suitable for the climate of Bahrain with low water consumption, high tolerance of soil salinity, high gas absorption levels, all of which are factors that contribute to reducing temperatures and providing large areas of shade.

The Ministry has executed a wide range of strategic projects for gardens and parks that serve the community, such as the development of the Water

Celebrating 60 Years of the Bahrain Garden Club:

## A LEGACY OF GREEN EXCELLENCE

It is well known that the club has enjoyed the patronage of His Highness the Late Amir Shaikh Isa bin Salman Al Khalifa, and this support has continued under the leadership of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa. The BGC also receives ongoing support from Her Royal Highness Princess Sabeeka bint Ibrahim Al Khalifa, Wife of His Majesty the King and President of the Supreme Council for Women (SCW), reaffirming the unlimited support provided to the agricultural sector by our wise leadership.

We have had the honor of joining the supporters of the Bahrain Garden Club since Riffa Views sponsored the Bahrain International Garden Show in 2007. Our relationship with BGC was further strengthened in 2019 when we signed a MoU with BGC. This partnership aimed to benefit from the club's accumulated expertise in gardening and to provide experts for lectures and workshops in various agricultural fields.

Over the years, we have organized numerous events for Riffa Views residents in partnership with BGC. These activities include training programs, workshops on garden design, and judging competitions in agricultural activities organized by Riffa Views. We also offer suggestions and ideas to improve the agricultural systems at Riffa Views. Additionally, we are proud of our sponsorship of BGC, including the annual Riffa Views Cup for Art in School Gardens.



Since the launch of our distinguished residential project, Riffa Views has been committed to being one of the largest joint property projects in the Kingdom of Bahrain. It consists of 1,054 residential units of various sizes and includes 900,000 square meters of green area distributed among 40 communal gardens of different sizes. There are also green areas in front



of all residential units and along all internal streets and roads in Riffa Views. Additionally, the Royal Golf Club course spans 600,000 square meters. Green area in Riffa Views represents 56% of the total area of 2.7 million square meters.

When determining these green areas, Riffa Views focused on planting environmentally friendly trees and plants that enhance the urban environment by absorbing pollutants, intercepting dust and small particles, producing oxygen, reducing air temperature, slowing down wind speeds, and preserving the soil.

At Riffa Views, we are also committed to water conservation as a priceless national resource. We use over 500,000 cubic meters of treated water annually to irrigate communal and household gardens and green areas. This water is treated at the Riffa Views Wastewater Treatment Plant, which has an annual production capacity of 1.3 million cubic meters.

Furthermore, we have created artificial lakes covering 45,000 square meters, overlooking several communal gardens and residential units. These eco-friendly

lakes contain aquatic life, including small fish, and are home to several ducks that breed continuously. The lakes are fed using treated water from treatment plant, thus not burdening Bahrain's water resources. They require ten times less water than what is used for green area cultivation and attract various migratory birds.

Our company has also invested in clean energy by installing solar-powered lighting poles in communal gardens. This environmental investment aims to support sustainable development by reducing fuel use and eliminating pollution and toxic gases emitted from power generation stations. Solar lighting requires no electrical network connections or generators, ensures protection from power outages, and eliminates the need for ground cable installations, reducing pressure on the government electricity grid.

In line with this, we have also switched all lighting units to a low-voltage LED system, contributing to environmental preservation, reducing daily operational costs, and lowering regular maintenance expenses.

In 2023, we signed an agreement to establish a solar power plant to reduce carbon emissions and energy expenses, aligning with Bahrain's commitment to sustainability and environmental preservation. This developmental project will produce 70 GWh of energy, equivalent to planting over 810,000 seedlings for ten years, offsetting nearly 50,000 metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions.

From this perspective, we find that our strategic partnership with the Bahrain Garden Club fully achieves its intended goals and has positively impacted our initiatives toward sustainable development, particularly our annual achievement of high rates of green space expansion.

In conclusion, we extend our deepest thanks and appreciation to all members of the Bahrain Garden Club, especially the esteemed Ms. Zahra Abdulmalik and Ms. Tahra Jaber, for their sincere efforts and tireless work in raising awareness of the importance of agriculture and sustainable development. We also thank them for their continuous support of all programs and activities that serve our beloved kingdom, wishing the Bahrain Garden Club and all those involved continued success and prosperity.
